Business applications

Even the smallest business can now look beyond just 'accounting' packages.

It's worth checking out fully integrated management software packages covering everything from Customer management to accounts, and with everything in between, through to more specific requirements such as manufacturing, stock management, Supply chain, payroll and Customer Relationship Management packages.

Consider 'software as a service (SaaS) packages to compete with off the shelf 'Windows operating' packages. However, be careful about buying bespoke single applications to 'fix' problems. Integration with other packages may be harder than you think!

Note also that while good accounting software will help you manage your accounts efficiently once your business grows you often need more than just accounting packages. These can be difficult to manage and integrate with other packages.

Absolute essential: ensure you have reliable and very regular back-ups in place with a robust disaster recovery plan. Of the businesses that fail after a disaster (e.g. flood or fire) most are due to poor housekeeping of their essential business data.
